

The L-1011 Education Wing of the Airline History Museum

The Education Wing program includes:

- Museum displays of thousands of items associated with this era of aviation
- Tour of the AHM working hangar to experience the propeller driven era of commercial airliners
 - the first successful airliner, the Douglas DC-3
 - walk through the Martin 404
 - walk through the Lockheed Super G Constellation, only one left flying in North America—one of 3 flying in the world
- Outside, on the ramp, a visit to a modern jet airliner the 300 passenger Lockheed L-1011 Tristar originally flown by Kansas City's hometown airline, TWA. Students will visit
 - cockpit and sit in the pilot's seat
 - the baggage area
 - the galley (kitchen)
 - the overhead luggage unit (PSU)
 - the restrooms
- In the L-1011, students will hear presentations on
 - briefings given by the flight attendant
 - procedure for emergency exits by passengers
 - the current rules about passenger luggage and carry on items

At the conclusion, students are given a hand-out that includes a test to gauge their understanding of and learning from the presentation. The subjects covered in the test will include history, math and general comprehension of the material covered. The test will be graded and reviewed by their teacher(s).
